To the BHS Community,

We are nearly at Thanksgiving and it seems the semester is racing by us! I wanted to let you know of a couple of things happening at BHS.

J.P. Butler offered a free leadership training course for our students and several took advantage of this opportunity last Saturday. Thanks to J.P. for thinking of BHS and to those students who attended the training. Our Acuity testing is going well do to the hard work of Mr. King as we are completing the second round of testing. Initial reports are that we are achieving at a high level, but we still want to work on growth for our students in some cases. Please let your 9th and 10th graders know to do their best on the Acuity tests as it helps us prepare them for the CSAP/TCAP test this year and helps us monitor their progress in learning as it relates to the state standards.

The new evaluation process stemming from SB 109 is moving along. We are fortunate to be selected as one of only a handful of school districts to work with the Legacy Foundation, funding by the Gates Foundation, this year as we are a pilot district for the principal's evaluation tool. The evaluation is based on six standards for principal's making up 50% of my evaluation this year and the other 50% is student achievement. I am excited to see how my evaluation turns out with this new tool because it relates to how well our teachers and students are doing. I also think it is a great tool for me to become a better principal. I will keep you posted.

We are still looking for volunteers to attend our BHS SAAC meetings, the first Wednesday of every month from 3 P.M. to 4 P.M., in the IMC. We think this is a great place to get information about our school and to ask any questions you may have about the school. I appreciate all of the community support for our public schools as the school board is making decisions about the new charter school application. I will say that it has challenged us to find ways to increase the amount of choice within our own building and how we can better serve each of our students.

We appreciate the numerous hours of parent volunteers and do not take this gift for granted! Thanks for giving back so much to BHS. Please let me know if you are available for tutoring or mentoring opportunities with our students, if you have time, we can find you a place to make a difference! Along those lines, thanks to our Berthoud BASH foundation for the 20 new laptops to

be used in the IMC. Our students will get a lot of use out of those! It also gives us some flexibility to use the older laptops we had there before, in other classroom settings increasing the availability. That also allowed for the purchase of wireless microphones for the theater programs from my budget.


Please keep a close eye on grades and attendance on Infinite Campus as we get closer to holiday breaks so we are not surprised in a negative way! Also, keep in communication with our teachers and counselors and ask for assistance whenever you need it, we are here to help parents as well!

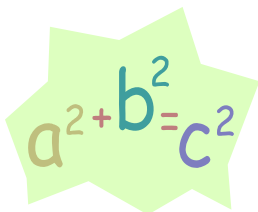
Holiday Choir Concert

Is It a Cold or the Flu?

Below are cold symptoms and flu symptoms. See the differences and similarities between a cold and the flu.

| Fever | Rare | Characteristic, high |
| Headache | Rare | Prominent |
| General Aches, Pains | Slight | Usual; often severe |
| Fatigue, Weakness | Quite mild | Moderate to Severe |
| Extreme Exhaustion | Never | Early and prominent |
| Stuffy Nose | Common | Sometimes |
| Sneezing | Usual | Sometimes |
| Sore Throat | Common | Sometimes |
| Chest Discomfort, Cough | Mild to moderate | Common; can become severe |
| Complications | Congestion, earache | Bronchitis, pneumonia |
| Prevention | None | Annual Vaccine, anti |
| Treatment | Treat Symptoms | Antiviral Meds first 24-48hrs |

Whether a cold or the flu- the best treatment is prevention. See the tips below.

- Avoid close contact:** Avoid close contact with people who are sick. When you are sick, keep your distance from others to protect them from getting sick too.
- Stay home when you are sick:** Stay home from work, school, and errands when you are sick. Keep sick children at home. You will help prevent others from catching the illness. If staff or students develop flue symptoms while at school, they may be given a mask to wear until they can leave school grounds.
- Cover your mouth and nose:** Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue when coughing or sneezing, throw the tissue away, and wash your hands. If you do not have a tissue, consider using your sleeve. "Why Don't You Do It In Your Sleeve" video can be viewed at: <http://www.coughsafe.com/media.html>.
- Wash your hands often:** Washing your hands and the hands of children often will help protect you from germs. Alcohol-based, hand sanitizers are also effective, students and staff may bring their own supply to school for individual use only.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth:** Germs are often spread when a person touches something that is contaminated with germs and then touches his or her eyes, nose, or mouth.
- Practice other good health habits:** Get plenty of sleep, be physically active, manage your stress, drink plenty of fluids, and eat nutritious foods.

When to stay home:

- You have a fever (100°F).
- You have a sore throat, cough, runny nose, body aches, vomiting, or diarrhea

COUNSELING NEWS

Second Semester Schedules

Second semester schedules will be available on portal beginning Monday, December 5th. **If there are any concerns, students may make an appointment with his or her counselor during the student's time release or study hall prior to Add/Drop Day.**

We have scheduled **ADD/DROP DAY** for **Wednesday, December 21st** from **1:30 to 3:00 PM** for all students.

This will be your **last** opportunity to change classes for second semester. If your student requires a schedule change, it is mandatory that your student bring their schedule and completed Add/Drop form to school on that day. *This form requires a parent signature.* Remember, you may change classes only if:

1. Prerequisite was NOT met.
2. Student registered for wrong ability level course as verified by teacher.
3. Error was made by the school. (We have kept ALL pre-registration sheets)
4. Student hardship (requires administrative approval).
5. Graduation requirement not met (Seniors ONLY).

Registration for 2012-2013 Classes

During January and February counselors will be going into classrooms to do career and academic planning and guidance to help prepare students for making appropriate and relevant course requests for next year. Please take some time to carefully review your student's plans, as we build our master schedule based upon our students' course requests.

BHS Tutoring

Peer Support Counselors are available during each period to assist students with tutoring, organizational skills, and mentoring, etc. If your student has a study hall or time release and could benefit from a little extra help, call the counseling office or students may come in to request help. Students are served on the first-come first-served basis.

JUNIOR PARENTS

During junior classroom guidance, your student will be given a Junior Folder which is full of valuable resources for you and your student for post secondary options, a suggested time line for juniors and seniors, college admission requirements, ACT Test information, financial aid, scholarships, and much more.

SOPHOMORES AND THEIR PARENTS

A PLAN Test Interpretation will take place during 2nd semester conferences in February. Students and parents are encouraged to come learn more about how these results can assist you in making course requests for next year, and do some college and career planning.

You may register for either of two Test Options – the ACT Assessment or ACT Assessment Plus Writing, which includes a 30-minute Writing Test. Not all institutions require or recommend taking the ACT Writing Test in addition to the ACT Assessment. Check with the colleges you are considering or go to www.act.org for a list of institutions that have provided information about their policies – whether they require, recommend, or do not need results from the ACT Writing Test.

Transcripts

The counseling office sends out transcripts the last day of every week, which is usually Friday. Requests must be made two days prior to mail date through Naviance.

Sophomores and Juniors High School Programs at Front Range Community College

During classroom guidance in January, counselors will remind students of scholarship opportunities that are available to next year's juniors and seniors who are interested in attending one of Front Range Community Colleges' High School programs. Students interested in any of these programs will need to attend the field trip in January. There is a limit of 50 participants. An FRCC admission application will need to be completed and submitted to Mrs. Cline before they can attend the field trip. The permission slips will be available in the counseling office in January. Following this visit, if students are still interested they will be scheduled for a personal interview with a Front Range Community College representative the beginning of February. To be a competitive candidate for these scholarships, students must have good attendance, be working to their academic potential, have taken the related courses offered at BHS, and be interested in pursuing a career in a related field. 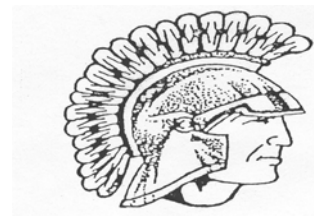
